Father,



SCHOOL HOURS: Commences: 9.00 Lunch: 11.20am until 12.00pm

Recess: 1.25pm until 2.00pm Dismissal: 3.00pm

OFFICE DAYS: The school Clerical Officer, Mrs Cotton is available; Monday-Friday 8.30 am – 3.00 pm

SCHOOL PHOTOS: Will be taken on Monday, February 10th. Envelopes will be sent home this week and should be returned by Photo Day. If you want a family photo, contact Mrs Cotton for a Family Photo Envelope. A notification will go out on Compass about ordering School Photos online.

<u>COMPASS</u>: If you haven't already done so, download the COMPASS App. As you create your account please check that your email is correct and if it isn't change it yourself or contact the school office. Make sure Notifications are turned on. For any COMPASS related issues contact Mr Moore.

SCHOOL UNIFORM: The wearing of the correct school uniform is expected. If your child needs to wear an alternative component of the school uniform for a day or two, no problem. However if the change looks as though it could take longer to sort out, I would ask you send a short note of explanation. I am very grateful to the vast majority of families who always support the school uniform policy and send their children dressed appropriately each day. I take this opportunity to remind you of the correct school uniform. **SCHOOL SHOES** are to be **black.** Black joggers are acceptable. However, soft slip on and white soled styles are **NOT** acceptable. **LACES** are black, not the coloured type. **SHORTS** are grey—corduroy, cargo and baggy styles are **NOT** acceptable. **SOCKS** are grey. Anklet style or white socks **are not** part of the school uniform.

A School Hat is an essential part of the School Uniform and Sunsafe Policies. The school has a No Hat – No Play Policy. To assist with sun protection parents are strongly urged to put sunscreen on their children every morning. Hats are available from Jan in the Office at a cost of \$20.00 each (The school does not supply loan hats for children who have forgotten their hats). Library Bags are available from Mrs Cotton in the Office and are \$15.00 each, Reusable Lunch Bags are also available from the Office at \$8.50 each.

It is my understanding that LOWES have run out of stick in certain items. Until this is resolved, check out the clothing pool or simply have your child wear some comfortable clothing.

ATTENDANCE: In accordance with the **Education Act**, schools are required to keep a daily attendance roll. All absences are recorded and when a note explaining the absence is sent to school the absence is coded accordingly. Parents are required to understand that "Its **Not** OK to be Away" The Act makes it clear that regular school attendance is compulsory, arriving on time is important and that lateness needs to be explained in the same way as other forms of absence.

As previously notified COMPASS is the new student information, parent communication and finance system, currently being rolled out across the Diocese, has commenced at St Benedict's. One noticeable change is the use of the student electronic sign in sign out Kiosk located at the front desk. An important aspect of COMPASS is the need to be punctual. Rolls are marked at 9.00am and all late comers must utilise the kiosk. This means all students arriving late (leaving early) MUST present at the front desk to be signed in (out) I ask all families to pass this information on to anyone engaged to bring their child and / or pick them up.

If you know your child is going to be absent, please let the school know as early as possible. Otherwise an absentee notification will be generated.

MESSAGES TO CHILDREN: If there is a need to ring the school with an important message for your child, eg. to catch the bus or take a different line at dismissal please ring BEFORE 2.00pm as notes are sent to classes at the end of recess (2.00pm). If your circumstance is unexpected and a message needs to be sent to your child after 2.00pm the latest a message could be passed on is 2.45pm. After that time it is difficult to be able to ensure the child gets the message in time as the school office is usually extremely busy at that time and cannot be left unattended while messages are delivered. In the interest of maintaining uninterrupted

teaching time I ask that you <u>do not</u> go to your child's class with a message unless you have presented at the school office. Mrs Cotton will be able to sort most things out

PARENT/TEACHER INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION: A "*Meet and Greet*" evening for mums and dads will be held on **Thursday February 20**th. A Sausage Sizzle will start at 4.45pm and conclude at 5.30pm. At this time there will be an opportunity to receive a class information pack that outlines aspects of the year ahead. Items will include content overviews of the Key Learning Areas; special class requirements, structures and organization, suggestions for keeping in touch, behaviour expectations and homework. There will also be an opportunity to formally meet your child's teacher if you haven't already had the chance to do so. If at all possible please make alternate arrangements for your children.

New families of Kindergarten 2020 are certainly welcome to the BBQ, however Mr Moore and Mrs Lojszczyk will not be available for a chat. A special Kindergarten Information Afternoon is scheduled for Tuesday, February 25th. More details will be forthcoming.

Please remember that communication is a 2-way street and as parents you need to make the effort to reach out to clarify matters when necessary.

I would hope that speaking with your child's teacher about his/her progress is something you feel comfortable doing and I encourage you to do so regularly. However, I would ask that you do not approach teachers during class teaching time and while they are on playground duty. I also ask that you do not come to the staff room doors. If you would like to contact a teacher during the day, present at the office and Mrs Cotton will let them know you would like a moment. It is more preferable to contact your child's teacher by email or note and arrange a time that is suitable to both parties.

Please note that teachers check their emails each afternoon before leaving school. They will respond as appropriate. If the matter needs attending to before this time (change of pick up time for example), ring Mrs Cotton or send a note addressed to your child's teacher.

To assist with student well-being, the school executive has specific roles and responsibilities. Ongoing concerns regarding children in the Infants classes (K-Yr 2) should be directed to Miss Collins, the school's Religious Education Coordinator and for matters relating to children in the Primary classes (Yr 3-6) should be directed to Mr Bailey the school's Primary Coordinator. Mr McCosker, the school's Assistant Principal will have responsibility for the Reflection Room and matters specifically relating to ongoing behavioural issues. Mrs Stephen, the school's Learning Support Teacher is also available and has wonderful resources for supporting you, your child and the classroom teacher in dealing with matters impacting on the teaching and learning process, behavioural and socialisation issues."

The first point of call with any class related issue is the classroom teacher. All other complaints and grievances should be directed to the appropriate member of the School Executive.

SAFER ROUTES TO SCHOOL:

The school carpark is closed from 8.40am until 9.15am and from 2.30pm until 3.15pm. The school carpark is far too small for us to allow parents to use it to drop off or pick up children. In addition and far more importantly it is an entry point for children and families and moving cars create a safety issue. It is only for the use of staff and services. Parents working on canteen and when picking up sick children are also able to use it, otherwise -

PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE CARPARK.

I would like to inform new parents and remind returning parents that parking on grass verges, median strips, across driveways and in no parking, no stopping and no standing zones is illegal and dangerous to the children. I make particular mention of the signs in Durham Drive. Children's Crossings are part-time crossings which operate just before and after school hours. They are highlighted by red flags with the words 'CHILDREN CROSSING' on them. When the flags are displayed you must slow down and STOP at the stop line if a pedestrian or Supervisor is on or entering the crossing. MOTORISTS MUST NOT PROCEED UNTIL ALL PEDESTRIANS ARE OFF THE CROSSING. When the flags are NOT displayed, it is not a crossing. A NO STOPPING sign means that in the area in the direction of the arrow you must not stand

(stop/park) your vehicle, at the times shown on the sign. The NO PARKING sign allows drivers enough time to let their children out of the car in the morning and to gather them in the afternoon. Parking rangers frequently visit to check the legality of parent parking habits and you will be fined for parking illegally.

I therefore ask parents to park legally and safely in the streets surrounding the school, this includes not parking across our neighbours driveways. The entrance road to the carpark is not to be used as a drop off point and to use the pedestrian signals to cross the road. All drivers are reminded of the importance of patience. Bus Zone signs means that in the direction of the arrow or arrows you are not allowed to stop your vehicle unless you are driving a bus. Hours of operation may apply to some signs. This means restrictions apply for those times only.

Parents are reminded that children who are picked by their parents in the afternoon only leave the playground if they walk out with you. Children whose parents aren't there on time wait on the green seat outside the staff room. Parents are asked to remind their children not to move away from the afternoon duty teacher unless they can actually see you. Parents are asked not to take children of an afternoon unless they are specifically asked by that child's parent and that child's parent has contacted the school advising them of the change to usual afternoon procedure. Taking a child home, even just into the car park, when you think they need your help, because you are a neighbour or you are a close friend IS NOT A GOOD IDEA!

At all times parents should be setting a good example, use the pedestrian crossing and lights appropriately and not to call their child across the road, please get out of the car, walk across the road and walk with your child. This is of particular importance to families that pick up children from Durham Drive and Suttor Streets. At dismissal time, parents are asked to be clearly visible to teachers and your children. Children are not to move off unless they can see you.

In the interest of student safety and protection of valuables, the riding of and / or bringing of skateboards to school is not permitted and the riding of and / or bringing of scooters is strongly discouraged. If your child rides a bike to school, ensure they know the road rules as they apply to bicycle riders and have a bike in roadworthy condition. This includes having a working bell. From time to time, it is advisable to check to see if they are putting what they know into practice. Children should travel by the most direct route to and from school. I ask that parents of children that walk or ride to school discuss road safety and have a clearly defined route to and from school in place.

Your child should know how they are getting home each day; bus, walkers, parent pick-up or whether they are going to Oosh. Walkers and bike riders should have a set route to and from school. Once an afternoon routine is established and teachers get to know how your child usually gets home, alterations should be notified to your child's teacher. This would be a great assistance when your child isn't where they are supposed to be.

Parents are asked to pass on this information to anyone who they may use to transport their children to and or from school.

<u>COMPLAINTS and GRIEVANCES</u>: Staff make decisions every day and many are directly concerned with your children. Professional judgement, educational guidelines, school policies and experience are just some of the factors used to frame these decisions. However, what is consistent in all decisions is the genuine care the staff has for your children and the fact that they always have their best interest at heart; regardless of whether it is rewarding a positive action or giving a consequence to an inappropriate choice.

With that said I accept that not all decisions, although made with every good intention, are absolutely 100% correct and from time to time disagreements and conflict may arise which may result in complaints and grievances being expressed. **St Benedict's, like all schools – in fact most workplaces has a "Complaints and Grievance' Policy.** In short, it outlines appropriate and acceptable procedures to express dissatisfaction, so that mutual respect and fairness are ensured and that the dignity of those involved is maintained. I stress that the office foyer is not the place to display anger and frustration. All matters should be dealt with in a calm manner and preferably in a quiet place.

SCHOOL FEES: The Catholic Schools depend upon the continued reliability of parents in the matter of prompt payment of fees for their survival.

A separate one off account for Text Books is sent home in Term 1. Individual grade costs in 2020 are: - KINDY - \$40.00, YEAR 1- \$25.00, YEAR 2 - \$40.00, YEAR 3 - \$55.00, YEAR 4 - \$55.00, YEAR 5 - \$55.00 and YEAR 6 - \$40.00 This fee is generally payable before Text Books are issued.

A School Fee Account is sent home to parents early in each term for payment as soon as possible.

<u>NB</u>:-At St Benedict's School Fees are billed over 3 terms (30 weeks). The fees and levies outlined below are in addition to the above tuition fee schedule.

A Family Discount Information Sheet has been sent home. It was made clear that all families returning to St Benedict's in 2020 were required to fill in this form and return to the School Office by a given date. Failure to return this form could result in families who might otherwise be entitled to a discount missing out. If you are unsure if you have completed this form, contact Mrs Cotton immediately.

In the main, children are supplied with the necessities for normal school work. These are covered by the **Resource Fee**, which is added to the account for school fees. This fee covers the initial supply of consumable items such as writing books, pencils and pens etc and the ongoing costs of photocopy paper and art/craft materials. In 2020, the Resource Fee is \$186.00 per child. The **Technology Fee** in 2020; which assists with the maintenance and replacement of hardware, purchase and renewal of software and payment of licensing, is \$96.00 per family. The Technology Fee assists the school invest in new and maintain existing infrastructure, purchase new and update existing licences and assists the purchase of new hardware and funding the cyclic replacement of hardware. The **Maintenance Fee** in 2020; which assists with the maintenance of the school grounds and minor repair work, is \$50.00 per family. **The Diocesan Family and School Building Levy** (**DF&SBL**), is used to finance capital works in schools and the establishment of new schools. In 2020 the DF&SBL is \$1250.00 per family per year and is payable to the school your eldest child attends. Since 2017, a voluntary annual contribution per family is being sought as a Diocesan Pastoral Contribution. In 2020 the contribution is \$300.00 (\$100 per term). Details of the initiatives this contribution will support is available from the office.

School Fees may be paid either by cash, cheque, credit card, eftpos, Bpay or Direct Debit and accounts need to be paid within 30 days of receipt of Fee Statements, unless arrangements are made with the Principal. Direct Debit forms are available from the school office. You are reminded that <u>fee arrangements and concessions must be renegotiated annually</u> and parents must contact the Principal so that agreements can be finalised.

During the year the school may invite educational shows to the school. These are considered of educational value. Parents may also be asked for money to cover the cost of excursions and sporting days. When educational shows, excursions or sports days are organised the school is mindful of placing extra financial burden on top of the fees outlined.

Parents who find themselves in difficulties with the payment of fees are asked to make an appointment with the Principal for a confidential discussion on the matter. A Health Care Card entitles parents to a tuition fee concession. If you have a **Family Health Care Card** please contact Jan in the Office for an Application for HCC concession. As with any Fee Agreement these need to be renewed each year.

<u>CHILD PROTECTION LEGISLATION:</u> The Catholic Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle has an absolute and abiding commitment to promote the safety, welfare and wellbeing of children. As a parent sending your child or children to a Diocesan school, you should be aware of your rights and obligations in protecting your child and all children in our schools.

The Children and Young Person's (Care and Protection) Act 1998

In NSW we are able to report certain information to Family and Community Services (FaCs). If we are concerned for one of more of the children in the school, we can discuss our concerns with a teacher, Assistant Principal or Principal. We can report our concerns to the FaCS Child Protection Helpline (Ph. 133 627, 24 hrs/7 days) if we have reasonable grounds to suspect that a child or young person is at risk of significant harm and our concerns are current. Risk of significant harm may occur from a single act or omission or to a series of acts or omissions.

Part 3A of the Ombudsman Act 1974

Part 3A Ombudsman Act 1974, defines Diocesan schools as a 'designated non-government agency' and as such we must have systems for preventing, reporting (to the Ombudsman) and investigating reportable conduct.

All staff and volunteers in Diocesan schools fall within the scope of Part 3A and may be investigated for alleged 'reportable conduct' which includes sexual offences, misconduct, assault, ill-treatment, neglect and behaviour that causes psychological harm to children.

Zimmerman Services is the Diocese's specialist child protection service who works with the Ombudsman to ensure the Diocese meets its obligations under Part 3A.

The Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012

Under this legislation people who work in a paid or volunteer capacity in the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle are required by law to have a Working with Children Check Clearance. This 'Clearance' can be obtained from applying online at check@kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au.

As a parent, if you learn about a staff member or a volunteer working in the school without a Clearance, you should talk with the Principal or Assistant Principal as soon as possible. If you believe that nothing is being done about your concerns you can contact Zimmerman Services directly (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri 08:30 to 5pm).

Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle Reporting Policy

As a parent you can report any concerns you have for a student, or group of students, to our principal, assistant principal or directly to Zimmerman Services (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri 08:30 to 5pm). The Diocese's reporting policy and procedures are available to everyone on the Diocesan website:

Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle Reporting Child Protection Concerns

As parents you are entitled to contact Zimmerman Services directly about any concerns we have about the safety, welfare or wellbeing of a child or if you are concerned that the school isn't addressing allegations of reportable conduct or abuse. (Ph. 4979 1390 Mon-Fri, 08:30 to 5pm).

You should have received, contact the School Office immediately if you have not, information about the School Community Code of Conduct and Conditions of Enrolment. Upon acceptance of enrolment and as a condition of continuing enrolment in our Catholic schools, all members of the school community are bound by this Code of Conduct. The School Community Code of Conduct was developed to reinforce rights and responsibilities for students, parents and volunteers within our school communities. Staff are bound by the Catholic Schools Office Code of Conduct. Please read, sign and return the Conditions of Enrolment Declaration immediately.

<u>MOBILE PHONES</u>: Unless your child has a specific need, mobile phones should not be brought to school. If there is a good reason please put your request to me in writing. Your children should be clear in that the phone should not be taken out of their bag unless needed and it is not a good idea to tell others you have it at school. Naturally the school takes no responsibility for the care and safe keeping of mobile phones brought to school.

ANAPHYLAXIS: there are a number of students at St Benedict's who have life threatening anaphylactic allergic reactions to all nuts And peanut products. Families are asked NOT to end send peanut butter, Nutella, sesame seeds. loose nuts, muesli, nut chocolate bars or any products containing any type of nut to school, The children are encouraged Not to share food at school.



<u>MEDICATION:</u> All medication is to be brought to the office immediately on arrival at school and not left in school bags. Any child needing medicine at school requires a Dispensing Medication Form which available at the office. Parents are responsible for providing Action Plans for health related matters.

It is important that you respond to notes even if the answer is NO.


